PET INSURANCE TOPS \$3.5 BILLION

Per <u>The North American Pet Health Insurance</u> <u>Association (NAPHIA)</u> pet insurance premiums were \$3.51 **billion** for 2022, up 23.5% vs 2021. **More than 5.36 million pets were insured across North America**. In the **US**,• Total premium volume* was \$3.22 billion (+24.2%) • 80.1% of insured pets were dogs; 19.9% were cats• The average annual accident & illness (A&I) premium for dogs was \$640(\$53/mo.)• The average annual A&I premium for cats was \$387(\$32/mo.)
