Since 1997, CCAS has fixed & found homes for more than 80,000 pets. In 2015, the new \$1.5 million adoption center expansion, sponsored by the Camden County Board of Freeholders, was completed, which increased capacity... BALTIMORE CO. MD--FOCUS ON S/N

The Animal Services Div. of the Baltimore Co. Dept of Health announced in Dec that they had done their 10,000th S/N since opening an on-site surgical suite in Fall 2013. A 2nd S/N site opened Dec. 3rd .They have a combined goal of S/N'g 20,000 cats & dogs in 2017. They have received a grant from the Maryland Dept. of Agriculture to cover the costs of fixing 1,083 dogs & cats in 3 specific Zip codes at **no charge**. The Division plans on concurrently offering free S/N services for the same number of animals from 6 other zip codes. As we reported in Aug 2014, Maryland increased the registration fee that companies must pay to sell pet food in Maryland, adding a surcharge to fund state wide S/N aimed @ lowincome communities,
