<u>"FIXING" HIPPOS IN COLUMBIA!</u>

In 1981, Columbian druglord Pablo Escobar imported 4 hippos for his personal "zoo". He was killed in 1993 & his animals removed except the hippos (now #'q > 100.)"non-native" & thriving. Despite hippo-protective laws, culling is being considered. So, "Animal Balance" & their Vet, Columbia-based Dr. Naudín, R working w/scientists, & vets on a humane solution for wellbeing of people, hippos & ecosystem. Plan is to sterilize > 80% of the hippos in 5 yrs, a huge job. Due to hippos' size, weight, anatomy, & semi-aquatic habits, safest choice likely tubal ligations & vasectomies. PFA's NEW MILLVILLE CLINIC


